Lavishly pigmented and carved with intricate detail, this petite mythical figurine was originally a decorative element from an ornate 19th-century bed surround. Dressed in military attire and riding a kingly lion into battle, the figure depicts a warrior character from the classic Chinese novel "Romance of the Three Kingdoms." Though the weapons in his hands have been lost to time, it's clear this figure was a fearsome adversary.

A 14th-century historical novel attributed to playwright Luo Guanzhong, "Romance of the Three Kingdoms" is a dramatized account of the final years of the Han dynasty and the emergent power struggles of the Three Kingdoms period, spanning from 169 to 280 AD. Continued...
