Though their residences were separate and closely guarded from other men, the women would often accompany the emperor on his travels, as depicted in this painting of a group of women enjoying the fresh air of a seaside retreat. Executed with delicate brushwork and brilliant color derived from minerals, vegetables, and precious stones, this Indian miniature painting reveals the luxuries and vibrancy of harem life.
